- offer specialist English language support
- support our NCEA students to succeed in their journey to NZ university entrance
- provide an extensive range of subjects for students to ensure that each student finds their place and can excel
- have a renowned outdoor education department that provides kayaking, surfing, paddle boarding, hiking and mountain biking.



Caring for our students

We provide:

- long term, caring and inclusive homestay families for students 14 years and older
- a dedicated international team who focus on providing a safe, supportive, productive and fun time at Wellington High
- activities throughout the year that have included an International dinner, Chinese and Lunar New Year celebrations and pizza lunches
- on-site student counselling with three experienced professional counsellors





Beyond the classroom

Wellington High students are encouraged to be involved in activities outside of the classroom and we offer:

- access to 27 different sports and two gymnasiums on site
- over 25 cultural clubs such as debating, Shakespeare Society, Feminist Club, Unicycling and the Environmental Club.
- a dedicated International room for sharing lunch and networking
- three-week activity programme for senior students not undertaking school exams.
