


Our school embraces diversity. The culture of inclusion extends to students (international and domestic), staff and community.

OUR COMMUNITY



HOKITIKA

Westland High School is located in Hokitika, a town of 3000 people - hokitika.org.nz. Hokitika is surrounded by the majestic mountains of the Southern Alps, lush rainforests, untamed rivers and wild unspoilt coastline. Westland High School and the wider community celebrate its Māori heritage and the significant and unique status of our tangata whenua. More than 28% of WHS students identify as Maori. Our town has a friendly, relaxed atmosphere with many cafes, galleries and a new multipurpose sports facility, DWC Westland Sportshub.

POUNAMU

Pounamu (also known as Greenstone) holds a significant cultural, spiritual and historical significance and is often worn as special locally carved jewellery.

Hokitika has a wide range of sporting and cultural clubs making use of the exquisite outdoor environment and first-class facilities on offer.

OUR CURRICULUM



Westland High School offers an extensive range of subjects.

We are also a member of the Toki Pounamu cluster of West Coast schools embracing digital learning. This provides a seamless transition from primary school where our students are also engaged in Learn, Create, Share pedagogy that has proven to lift student achievement. At Westland High School students will be required to use their own Chromebooks for learning in most classes.

Senior School - Years 11 - 13

National Certificate in Educational Achievement (NCEA) qualifications are available.

Each subject offers up to 4 hours of class time.

There are three levels in the senior school. Students may take a multi-level course. Scholarship programmes are offered in University Entrance subjects.

Students who express a desire to study courses not currently offered due to low interest can study these through distance learning with assistance from teachers i.e. philosophy, psychology, agricultural business, etc...

OUR SUPPORT NETWORKS

Westland High School embraces each student's unique needs and potential and provides a support system. International students have additional support networks.

WHANAU:

Each student is allocated to a hapū group. Each hapū is divided into whānau groups (form classes) that are made up of students from years 7 to 13. The whānau groups meet each morning for registration and information sharing. The whānau teacher provides the first pastoral care level, with career guidance, goal setting and general welfare.

The Hapū are named in English and Māori and have primary colours used on special occasions e.g. sports day

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME

Westland High School is a signatory to the Education (Pastoral Care of Tertiary and International Learners) Code of Practice 2021.

We welcome students from a variety of countries - from Japan to Germany. We have short stay group visits (10 -20 days) and long stay individual programmes (3 months - 2 years.)



International students especially enjoy a uniquely New Zealand experience including:

- being home-hosted.
- experiencing school life as a 'Kiwi'.
- being part of a small international programme.
- our range of academic courses and the very special Outdoor Education class.

We offer the opportunity for our International students to prepare for New Zealand's University Entrance and NCEA Level 3 qualifications.

Domestic students are provided the opportunity for International exchange.
